Joyce Byrd ~ White Memorial Presbyterian Church, Willow Spring

The Session of White Memorial Presbyterian Church in Willow Spring presents the name of Joyce Ann Byrd for nomination as an outstanding older adult child of God in our Christian family.

Joyce is one of 5 sisters, she being the middle child of Lon and Ruby Coats Byrd. Lon was a Deacon at White Memorial elected in December 1973. Joyce grew up on her family's farm 3 miles from White Memorial Presbyterian. In her early years her parents brought her to Sunday School at White Memorial then picked her up to attend a Baptist Church for worship. Joyce married James Wilton Byrd on January 22, 1954. They had one son Russell Kent Byrd. Joyce became a member of White Memorial June 1971. Her husband died of a heart attack after 43 years of marriage. Joyce has 2 grandchildren, Kimberly Byrd Knugh and Dustin Byrd. She helped out Dustin with his business being in the office when she was needed.

Kitty Stephenson was Joyce's Mom's aunt and was instrumental in the startup of a Bible school and in the planning of the church building. She donated the land for our church. This was the beginning of White Memorial Presbyterian Church, Willow Spring.

Joyce worked as a preschool teacher at the day care of Freewill Baptist Church in Raleigh for 4 years. She left to take care of her Dad when her Mother died suddenly of a heart attack. She later worked at a private day care facility in Garner for 21 years.

Joyce has always volunteered with our Sunday School and Vacation Bible School programs. There was also the big job of caring for preschool children during our worship service. Joyce is a member of the Congregational Care Team and also a member of the Building and Grounds Committee.

Joyce faithfully attends the monthly meeting of the Women's Circle. Visiting the sick and homebound has always been a part of Joyce's service to church members. Exhibiting the love of our Lord is what Joyce does in every aspect of her life. Faithfulness in attending Sunday School and worship, taking her turn at the nursery and ushering, her kind nature, her willingness to help where needed and her quiet gentleness are qualities that Joyce exhibits. In addition she is always dependable and trustworthy. She is always smiling. One of her favorite things to do is singing the old time sing-a-longs and worship quietly through it all.

We want to honor Joyce because we believe that she exemplifies what it means to be a faithful follower of Jesus to her family, to her community and to fellow worshippers at White Memorial Presbyterian Church.

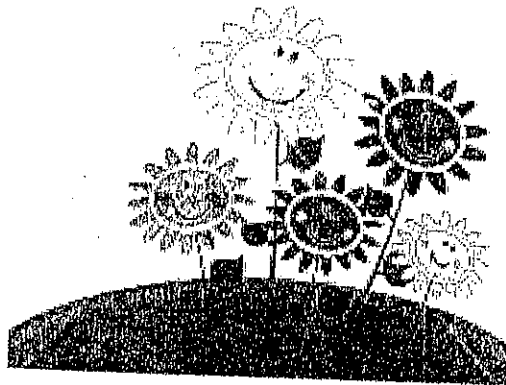

---Susan and Mel Foster have sold their beach house at Oak Island and are going to Disney with their children in May as consolation! (for Susan)

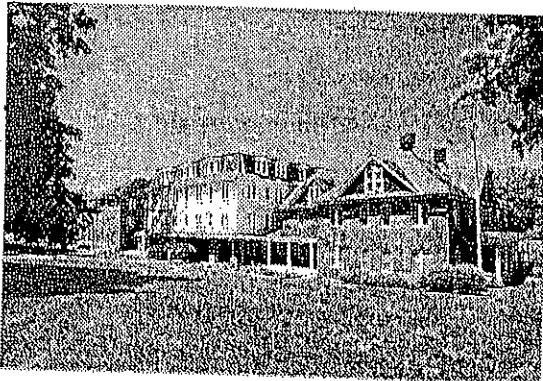
The Living Waters Capital Funds Campaign to restore the Historical Hotel has made good but slow progress. The goal is to eventually offer another 55 private rooms and baths with period styling. Over \$3m has been raised, including revenue from the sale of 30 acres with Boyers Road frontage, on the back side of Massanetta. The Boyers property revenue provides a \$1m cornerstone of the \$6m required to complete the next major phase of the project. This initiative assures that we will continue to be adult-friendly, as well as expand our capacities for adult retreats, family events, and conference center utilization. These are long term imperatives to enhance our ministries as well as to increase occupancy rates and revenue. We are evaluating if we might offer an advance taste of this future by the remodeling six of these rooms on the second floor of the north wing.

Meanwhile, as friends have made donations to honor Fred and Laura Holbrooks' services over the last decade, we are building a Labyrinth at the old Shenandoah Lodge site above the springs. We are utilizing funds from over 100 donors to honor the Holbrooks' service and to fulfill one of their dreams for Massanetta. The Labyrinth will also offer another opportunity for inspired prayer and worship in fulfillment of our Mission Statement.

As a non-profit ministry of the Synod, we are grateful for our opportunity to share our mission in churches and presbyteries. Prayer support, utilization of the center, volunteer services, and financial support are always a challenge. **Those individuals and churches who love Massanetta are asked to give \$260,000 in unrestricted gifts towards the \$1,475,000 2015 budget!** We enjoy the support of 57 Covenant Churches – churches who promise annual unrestricted gifts of \$500 (\$250 for churches under 200 members) or more to the ministry of Massanetta. The Covenant Church program is a major key to meeting the annual needs of the center.

The impact of remembering Massanetta by legacy giving was realized last fall as we were blessed to receive the Charitable Remaining Trust of Virginia S. Kerns, (102), who grew up in Winchester. Her gift of \$144,000 allows us to become debt free in 2015. **Hallelujah! Would you personally consider making Massanetta Springs part of your legacy?**
