

Walk with God's guidance into deeper faith and knowledge;


Stretch out to the needy with tangible acts of service;

A Reminder of the Meaning of Lent

Lent is a season of 40 weekdays and six Sundays, beginning on Ash Wednesday and culminating on Holy Week. During this season, the church in joy and sorrow, proclaims, remembers, and responds to the atoning of Christ. Two distinct periods at the end of Lent are Holy Week (the week immediately preceding Easter, beginning with Passion Palm Sunday) and the three days (the final three comprising of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil). Liturgical color: first five weeks --- Purple. Passion Palm Sunday --- red and/or purple. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday of Holy Week --- purple. Maundy Thursday --- purple. On Easter the color is white. Easter is the fifty day of the season of seven Sundays beginning with the Resurrection of the Lord (Easter Day) the festival of Christ's resurrection, Ascension Day, forty days after Easter, is celebrated to affirm that Christ Lord of all times and places. The Day of Pentecost marks the end of the Easter season. Liturgical color: white except Day of Pentecost which is red.

CONGRETATIONAL CARE TEAM UPDATE:

When we organized the CCT committee approximately 7 years ago, we thought 2 teams (consisting of 10-12 people) would better serve the bereaved families in our Church; however, after a year we discovered that it took more people than on just one team to participate in serving a meal when that's what the family requested...when refreshments only are requested, then it was not an issue. At White Memorial we (CCT committee) consisting of 6 members along with our pastor and Moderator, Rev. Carole McCartney, talked extensively about how we wanted to serve our bereaved members and concluded that we'd offer two options: light refreshments or a meal at the Church consisting of 1 meat (spiral ham/fried chicken); some type of potato; green beans; bread; desserts along with tea, sodas. The reason we decided on a "fixed menu" is because it helps in planning the amount of food needed and many of our members can only help by monetary donation. We purchase the meat & green beans and then have other food be homemade which gives us a feeling of "service". We also do "fillers" when we are not sure of number of people for the meal.

Margaret King and Becky Stephenson are the Team Coordinators. During the time without a pastor, CCT will contact the bereaved family and ask their preference then we put that into action. In writing this, we realize that we have not done a good job at becoming one team...we will strive to put out an email (or phone call) to all so you can sign up for what works best for you. Help us be better communicators! Please remember this meal is the "Church 's service" to the family; therefore, if you wish to take food to the home as a token of friendship & love, please do....it may be needed and very appreciated.

Thank you for your financial donations; your help in preparing the food; your help with set up/clean up; it is a GROUP effort and all of you have been so generous with your time and talent!

Easter Egg-Stravaganza




