Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

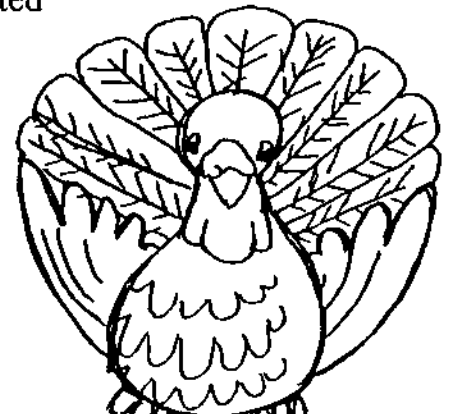

Stewardship - The Rich Young Man

While looking up the story of the rich young ruler, I found that it is retold in the three synoptic gospels – Matthew (19), Mark (10) and Luke (18). You don't have to take a hammer and beat me over the head for me to understand this **MUST BE IMPORTANT**. It is repeated three times. Two of the gospels refer to him as a Ruler which makes him seem important, smart, educated; the third refers to him as a man, perhaps less important but still seeking and in need of the lesson. He asks Jesus, "Teacher, what good thing must I do to get eternal life?" Jesus points out that, yes, he needs to obey the commandments to which the man replies "All these I have kept. What do I still lack?" Jesus replies, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell your possessions and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me."

To the young man this was an impossible task which allows Jesus to emphasize that "with man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

Recently, Henry used the Mark Gospel version to preach this story where Jesus advises us "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God."

I know that those of us reading this love the Lord and work diligently to do his will – to love God and to love our neighbors . And likely, none of us will "sell everything" to give to the poor. Nor do I believe that is the Lord's intention. The treasure of eternal life is not to be earned by self-denial or giving of one's material goods but it is to be received by following Jesus. In giving away his wealth, the young man would have removed the obstacle (perhaps in his case an idol) that kept him from trusting in Jesus. He had a greater love of his possessions than for eternal life.

So as we embark on a month of "generosity" and "generous thoughts and actions," let us keep our eyes, ears, hearts and minds on the Lord - on our spiritual life and our earthly living, service, sowing and giving. God is the ultimate generous giver offering up his Son to atone for our sins and promising the gift of eternal life. Let us pray and contemplate how we can return to him a portion of his goodness to us for His work at in our community and in the world.

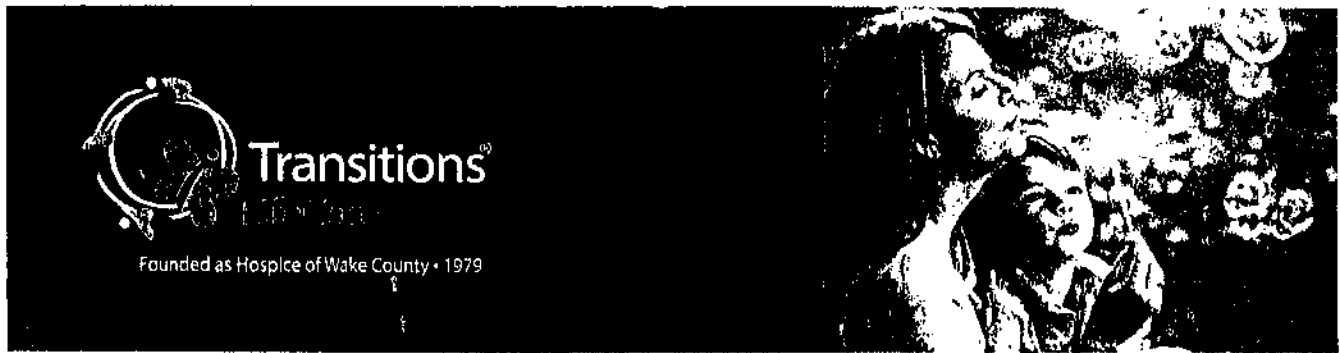
