
At the May Session meeting, it was brought to our attention that our usual drop-off at Pleasant Grove Baptist Church was overflowing. It was suggested that we could give our donated food and paper goods to the West Johnson High School Food Pantry. The Session agreed. So for the past few months the Food Basket has been taken to West Johnson High School Food Pantry. It has been well received.

Along with the donated food and paper goods, we gave them a grant application from New Hope Presbytery's Domestic Hunger Grant. This is otherwise known as the "Two Cents a Meal Program". The offering we take up once a month known as the "Hunger Basket" is sent to support this program. This financial support is combined with other churches in the Presbytery. The West Johnson High School Food Pantry Director has applied for this grant. It is usually March 2016 before the grantees are notified. Please keep this in your prayers. Don't forget!

On November 11th, Food Pantry Director Ms. Jeanette Neyman will speak during the worship service about this mission to the hungry. Indeed, White Memorial is **stretching out to the needy with tangible acts of service!**

Also on November 22nd at 3:00 p.m. at White Memorial "Transitions in Life" (formerly Wake County Hospice) will be offering a program on grieving. Everyday Stewardship

I love the Lord's sense of humor. "Why?" you ask. About 6 weeks ago, Don Smith asked me to peruse a booklet entitled "Giving – Fearless Generosity." I read one of the articles right away and then put the booklet into a pile of books and magazines I hope to read this year. Then I started thinking, I don't want to lead a Stewardship campaign, I have enough to do. More volunteer work! More time! No, I didn't want to do this. (Sound like anybody you might know?).

Then one morning in late September, while preparing questions related to Isaiah and Hebrews for our Bible in a Year class, I started thinking how all the books connect to one another. And what was that Jesus said back in January, in Matthew 22:17-21? (oh I didn't remember where the verses are – I had to look them up!). Here's how the Bible story goes.

"Then the Pharisees went and plotted how they might entangle Him in His talk. And they sent to Him their disciples with the Herodians saying, "Teacher, we know that You are true, and teach the way of God in truth; nor do You care about anyone for You do not regard the person of men. Tell us, therefore, what do You think? Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?"

But Jesus perceived their wickedness and said, "Why do you test Me, you hypocrites? Show Me the tax money."

So they brought Him a denarius. And He said to them, "Whose image and inscription is this?"

They said to Him, "Caesar's."

And He said to them, "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God, the things that are God's." When they heard these words, they marveled and left Him and went their way."

In Old Testament law, God's chosen people were instructed to give 10% (a tithe) as an offering. Jesus said, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God, the things that are God's." ...and give to God, the things that are God's (bears repeating). I don't know about you, but my answer was EVERYTHING! He gave us EVERYTHING! There isn't one person that I know or thing I own that wasn't made possible and given to me generosity of God. Look around. Creation – the beauty and marvels of the universe; the gift of life, my life, your life; the talents and fruits of the spirit that God generously bestows on us; the work we have been blessed to do in our lifetime to serve others – even volunteering, Deirdre (he whispered); the housing, food, healthcare, financial resources that carry us through each day, each a gift from Him. We live in a free country, the richest country in the world with great opportunities. So what hasn't God given us?

The widow (Luke 21:1-4) understood giving all to God and she is the shining example for all of us.

So these things were put upon my heart to write for the newsletter and then I picked up Don's booklet again to read the recommendations for weeks three and four of a four-week campaign. I should tell you the first is **Fearless Living**, second **Fearless Service**, third **Fearless Sowing** and fourth – which I read, laughed and said aloud – "You really have a sense of humor, Lord," was **Fearless Giving** with references to tithing and the widow. I got His message. Hope you get it, too, during November's Stewardship lessons and throughout the whole year.

Upon hearing the bad news, the husband turns to his wife and asks 3 questions:

- 1) Did you cut off the oven in the kitchen before we left? (actually probably should have asked that question much earlier, but anyway this is the way the story was told.....); the wife answered YES.**
- 2) Are the life insurance policies paid up? The wife answered YES.**
- 3) Did you turn in the church stewardship pledge cards? The wife answered "Oops honey, NO I forgot that".**

The husband exclaimed : " That's great!! The church is sure to find us!!".

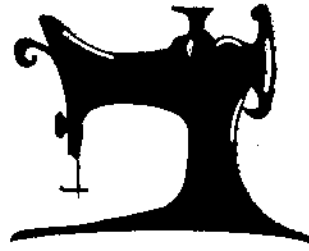

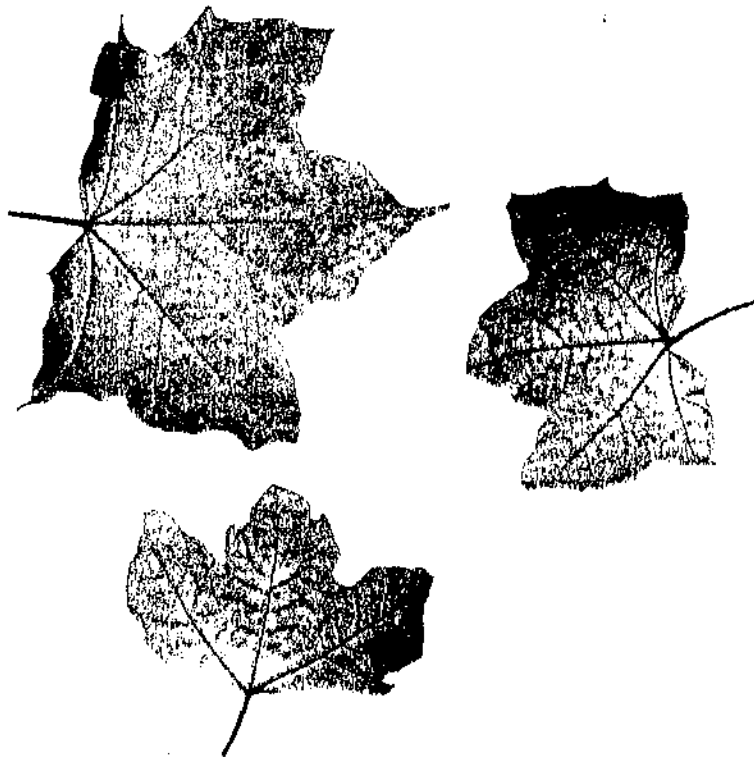
Mission Project Needs Seamstresses
