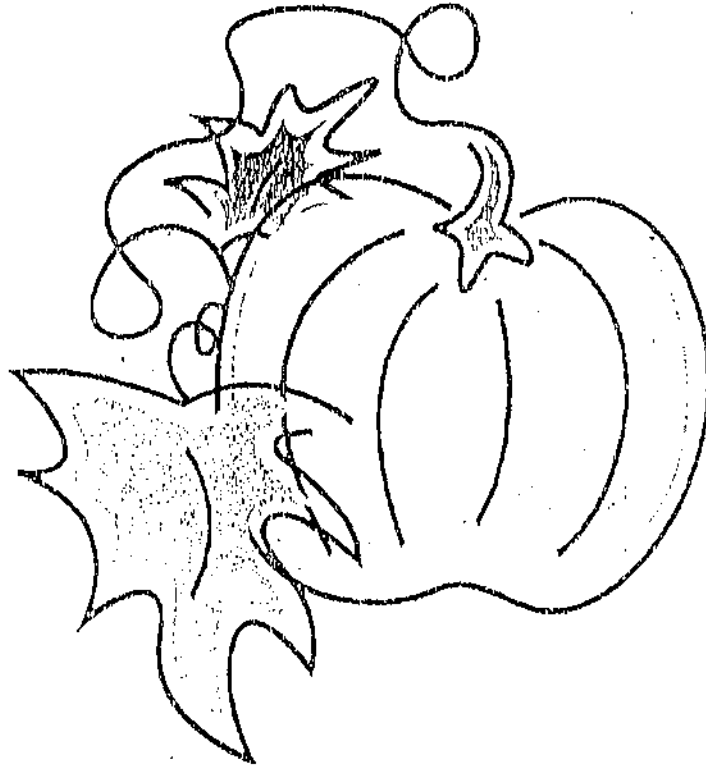

Powerful faith

Grace and peace be with you all in the name of Christ! I continue to be so blessed by new friends and the wonderful faith full energy at White Memorial. Thank you for the gracious hospitality and kindness that you all have extended to Kathy and me. I continue to see that your/our faith is strong and foundational. We have covered a lot of ground in these two months so far. We've talked about forgiveness, compassion and faith and so much more in our Session and committee meetings.

I think the disciples had it right; faith is the gift of God. We often pray that God will increase our faith and so time spent in prayer is fundamental to our faith development. But there are also other things that we can do to engage with God, who wants to increase our faith. There are many ways to build our faith.

Thought - Participating in the worship and life of the church is paramount to building our faith. One way to do this is by inviting friends and neighbors to outreach and service programs.

Word - The scriptures inform and correct our faith. Without the guidance of the scriptures, we tend to have faith in something smaller than God. The scriptures keep drawing us to God so that we can develop the kind of powerful faith of which Jesus speaks of.

Deed - We grow in faith as we act in faith. Every gift of God is strengthened by the exercise of it, and this is true of faith. However, one word of caution: Just as the ordinary foot soldier sees too little to know how well or badly the battle is going, the ordinary Christian also has limited vision. The early Christians who were dying on crosses alongside the roads or in the Coliseum were acting in faith, and some may have felt that God had betrayed their faith. Faith means believing even when the outcome seems in doubt.

The point is NOT that God does not reward obedience, but that our obedience never puts God in our debt. We exist for God, not he for us. As the one who is unimaginably supreme over us, he deserves our total loyalty and unstinting obedience: it is merely the fulfillment of a natural obligation. Our salvation is therefore always dependent on God's grace (God's undeserved favor—God's gift). We stand in need of grace every day.

I look forward to getting to know you all better as we move in to the Fall season filled with faith and bounded in grace. Grace and peace be with us all.

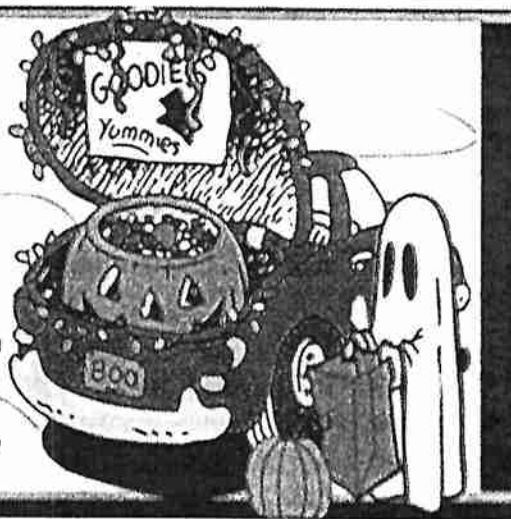

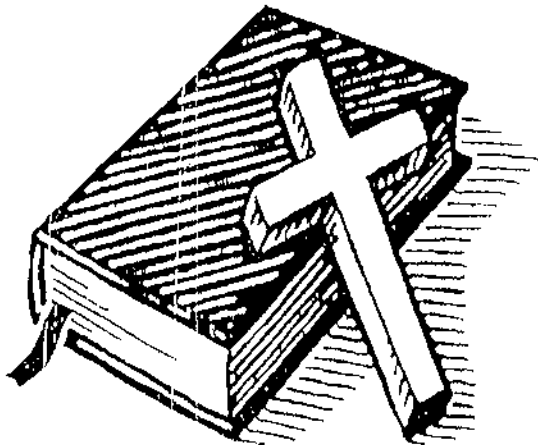
