

Come to Haiti! We are off to a good start in getting the first ever WMPC International Mission Trip together. There is still time for you to join us for the 10th Anniversary trip. The dates are May 25th to June 2nd in 2017. Pastor Ed and Kathy will lead the team to the Yahve Jire Children's Foundation in Despinos Haiti. The total cost for the trip is \$1,800. The first deposit of \$100 is due December 15th to lock in our air fare (please talk to Kathy if you need just a little more time). There are so many ways to be involved. THE SECRET BEHIND THE SONG


People often think of the Twelve Days of Christmas as the days preceding the festival. Actually, Christmas is a season of the Christian Year that last for days beginning December 25 and lasting until January 6 – the Day of Epiphany – when the church celebrates the revelation of Christ as the light of the world and recalls the journey of the Magi. From 1558 until 1829 people in England were not allowed to practice their faith openly. During this era someone wrote "The Twelve Days of Christmas" as a kind of secret catechism that could be sung in public without risk of persecution. The song has two levels of interpretation:

"The surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of the church."

Each element in the carol is a code word for a religious reality.

- 1. The partridge in a pear tree is Jesus Christ.
- 2. The two turtledoves are the Old and New Testaments.
- 3. Three French hens stand our faith, hope, and love.
- 4. The four calling birds are the four Gospels.
- 5. The five gold rings recall the torah (Law) the first five books of the old Testament.
- 6. The six geese a-laying stand for the six days of creation.
- 7. Seven swans a-swimming represent the sevenfold gifts of the Spirit.
- 8. The eight maids a milking are the eight beatitudes.
- 9. Nine ladies dancing are the nine fruits of the spirit (Gal.5).
 - 10, The ten lords a-leaping are the Ten Commandments.
 - 11. Eleven pipers piping stand our eleven faithful disciples.
 - 12. Twelve drummers drumming symbolize the 12 points of belief in the Apostles Creed.

There you have it. The HIDDN meaning of the "The Twelve Days of Christmas" and the secret behind the song.
